GENERAL ORDER 22-1

General Order 19-2 of this Court adopted the Interim Rules governing the Small Business Reorganization Act of 2019 while those rules are undergoing the three-year process of enactment under the Rules Enabling Act.

On June 21, 2022, the President signed the Bankruptcy Threshold Adjustment and Technical Corrections Act (BTATC Act), Pub. L. No. 117-151 (2022), which temporarily increases, for a two-year period, the debt threshold in cases filed under subchapter V of chapter 11. The BTATC Act is retroactive to March 27, 2022. Interim Bankruptcy Rule 1020, attached hereto, was amended accordingly.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 2071, Rule 83 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, and Rule 9029 of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, Interim Rule 1020 is adopted by this Court.

1 Interim Rule 1020. Chapter 11 Reorganization Case for 2 Small Business Debtors or Debtors Under Subchapter V 3 (a) BUSINESS—DEBTOR 4 DESIGNATION. In a voluntary chapter 11 case, the debtor shall state in the petition whether the debtor is a small 5 6 business debtor or a debtor as defined in § 1182(1) of the 7 Code and, if the latter so, whether the debtor elects to have 8 subchapter V of chapter 11 apply. In an involuntary chapter 9 11 case, the debtor shall file within 14 days after entry of the 10 order for relief a statement as to whether the debtor is a small 11 business debtor or a debtor as defined in § 1182(1) of the 12 Code and, if the latter so, whether the debtor elects to have subchapter V of chapter 11 apply. The status of the case as 13 14 a small business case or a case under subchapter V of chapter 15 11 shall be in accordance with the debtor's statement under 16 this subdivision, unless and until the court enters an order 17 finding that the debtor's statement is incorrect. 18 (b) OBJECTING TO DESIGNATION. The United States trustee or a party in interest may file an objection to 19 the debtor's statement under subdivision (a) no later than 30 20 days after the conclusion of the meeting of creditors held 21 22 under § 341(a) of the Code, or within 30 days after any amendment to the statement, whichever is later. 23

24 (c) PROCEDURE FOR OBJECTION OR DETERMINATION. Any objection or request for a 25 26 determination under this rule shall be governed by Rule 9014 and served on: the debtor; the debtor's attorney; the United 27 States trustee; the trustee; the creditors included on the list 28 filed under Rule 1007(d) or, if a committee has been 29 appointed under § 1102(a)(3), the committee or its 30 authorized agent; and any other entity as the court directs. 31

Committee Note

The Interim Rule is amended in response to the enactment of the Bankruptcy Threshold Adjustment and Technical Correction Act (the "BTATC Act"), Pub. L. No. 117-151, ____ Stat. ____. The BTATC reinstates the definition of "debtor" for determining eligibility to proceed under subchapter V of chapter 11 that was in effect from March 27, 2020 through March 27, 2022, under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281, as amended. Subdivision (a) of the rule is amended to reflect that change. This Interim Rule will terminate two years after the date of enactment of the BTATC, unless the Act is extended.
